Chapter Activities Summary, Fall 2024-Spring 2025

Fall 2024

During the fall semester, we welcomed Hilde Creager as our new President, Gail Lordi as Vice President and Jayashree Vangala as Webmaster. We continued virtual monthly meetings on second Tuesdays. Details regarding events which took place from month to month are included below.

September 2024

13 September (Virtual - Monthly Meeting): Our first event of the fall semester was a discussion with John Zarillo who serves on the Mentoring Subcommittee of the Mid-Atlantic Regional Archives Conference (he is also Head of Archival Processing at Georgetown University). John joined us to discuss MARAC's Mentoring Program, which connects cohorts of mentor and mentee archivists to develop their archival careers and participate in monthly discussions.

08 October (Virtual - Monthly Meeting): Our second event was a discussion on local history departments within public libraries. Our guest speakers were:

November 2024

12 November (Virtual - Monthly Meeting): We welcomed back Alisa Kraut, former SOURCE President and current Artifact Registrar of the Atwater Kent Collection at Drexel University, to teach a workshop titled "Crash Course in Historic Handwriting (for archival transcription)." The presentation included tips on how to decipher handwriting, using image editing to make digitized images more readable, and resources on how to participate in crowd transcription and build script reading comprehension.

December 2024

10 December (Virtual - Monthly Meeting): SOURCE held our final monthly meeting of the semester. We conducted elections. Hilde Creager was elected President. Kelan Amme elected VP. Christian Ryder re-elected Secretary. Jillie Fisch elected Webmaster.

January 2025

The newly elected board met privately on January 14 to review our responsibilities and beginning planning this semester's events. To resolve scheduling conflicts, we moved monthly meetings to Tuesdays at 7 pm.

February 2025

February 11 (Virtual - Monthly Meeting): We held a conversation with librarians and archivists at visual art museums. Our first speaker was Jared Ash, Florence and Herbert Irving Museum Librarian at the Thomas J. Watson Library at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. We were also joined by William A.

Peniston, Emeritus Librarian and Archivist at the Newark Museum of Art. Our guests spoke about how the special collections at their museum serve the research needs of their staff and the general public and present images from their collections.

March 2025

11 March (Virtual - Monthly Meeting): Kelan organized this event featuring presenters from his alma mater. Faculty and students of Messiah University reflected on the processes of creating a series of collaborative historical projects about the Pennsylvania Capital Region over the last fifteen years. The session highlighted how digital public projects can bring together students, scholars, and community members to cocreate collections that preserve local knowledge.

The presenters explored digital mapping, metadata creation, public exhibitions, intercultural histories, and mobile apps that bridge academic research and community engagement while fostering meaningful learning experiences.

25 March (Virtual -Monthly Meeting): Our second event of the month was a SAA orientation event with Lexy de Graffenreid, Co-Chair of the Society of American Archivists Membership Committee. This was a great opportunity for potential SAA new members to learn about the benefits, which include participation in SAA Sections and in the Mentorship Program. Lexy also spoke about the governance structure of SAA and how members can get involved. To organize this event we reached out to the SAA Membership Committee.

April 2025

8 April (Virtual - Monthly Meeting): Continuing this semester's theme of intersections of GLAM professions, we were joined by two speakers who are librarians working with visual art collections. Our first speaker was Molly Dotson, Graphics Arts Librarian at Firestone Library, Department of Special Collections at Princeton University. We were also joined by Nilda Lopez, Head of Reader Services at the Morgan Library and Museum. We also held elections. Kelan Amme was elected President. Hilde Creager was elected this time as Vice President. Jillie Fisch was re-elected as Webmaster. Tallulah Pentecost was elected Secretary, replacing Christian Ryder.
